Associate | Biblical Studies Program Outcomes | 2022

Purpose and Objectives

The 60-hour program leading to the Associate of Biblical Studies degree is designed for lay leaders and ministry support personnel in the church and parachurch organizations who require only foundational biblical studies. It may also be used for the first two years of a bachelor's degree program. Credits earned in this program may be applied to the bachelor's degree programs offered at the College or, when appropriate, may be transferable to other institutions.

1. Categorize the literary forms of biblical books.	Graduating students will be given the Bible Knowledge Exam. The goal is that students will equal or better the national average on this test on questions related to the literary forms of biblical books. A departmentally designed final exam will be used in BIBL 3311, BIBL 3312, and BIBL 3321. The goal is that students will achieve an average score of at least 70% on these exams. Traditional Houston English students averaged 78.79% on the departmentally designed final exams. English online students averaged 86.53 (94 total tests) on the departmentally designed final exams. Spanish online students averaged 89.71 (28 total tests) on the departmentally designed final exams. In 2019-2020, on- ground English students in Indianapolis and Fort Wayne fell slightly short of the plan. After review, it was determined that this was the first departmentally designed final exam these students took. It was assumed that these students would do better on future tests after gaining some experience handling them.
